## **MEETING MINUTES**

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October 3, 2025, 12:00 p.m.

1 CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 12:00 pm, held in the Executive Conference Room of City Hall in person.

2. ROLL CALL:

The following Committee Members were present:

3. PUBLIC COMMUNICATION:

Philip Friess spoke on his involvement as a LA City sub-consultant working on Hyperion facility improvements. He is going through steps to be hired on with the City of LA. Andrew and Dieema Wheaton spoke on their frustrations with the lack of communication from the City regarding the Chevron refinery fire.

4. CONSENT AGENDA:

Approval of Minutes from September 5, 2025. Vice Chair Butler made a motion for approval, seconded by Member Giri, approved unanimously.

5. SPECIAL PRESENTATION: Pure Water Los Angeles

Representatives from LADWP and LASAN presented and discussed a PowerPoint presentation on their proposed recycled effluent water project at the Hyperion facility. LA City staff included Huub H.J. Cox, Fredy Ceja and Patrick Horton. The proposed project would potentially be able to treat 230 MGD of discharge which equates to approximately half of the current outfall into Santa Monica Bay. The project would be completed in three phases with a final estimated completion date of 2050. Chair Miller-Zarneke suggested a tour of the current smaller scale recycled water project currently operating at Hyperion. Councilmember Baldino expressed concerns with the current operational management at Hyperion and whether those would carry over to the new recycled water operation. Environmental Programs Manager Pankau asked what start date was used for the proposed timeline. The PowerPoint presentation was made available online [and EIR comments were submitted via online platform by Pankau on behalf of the committee and City as a follow-up.]

6. REPORTS: Sub-Committee Updates

a. Blue Butterfly Conservancy: Vice-Chair Butler reported that the Hillside cleanup on September 27<sup>th</sup> was very well attended. He also shared his experience at most recent Technical Advisory Committee regarding the City's general plan update.

b. Eco-Friendly Public Events: This discussion was tabled until our November meeting due to time constraints.

c. Member Term Calendar: This discussion was tabled until our November meeting due to time constraints.

## 6. REPORTS-PUBLIC WORKS

a. Hyperion Update: Environmental Programs Manager Pankau gave updates regarding the Hyperion facility. For the previous two weeks ending on September 16<sup>th</sup>, 2025, SCAQMD received approximately 69 odor complaints. The facility was issued two Notices of Violation -- one on September 1<sup>st</sup>, the other September 10<sup>th</sup>.

b. City Sustainability Efforts: Environmental Programs Manager Pankau let the group know about two upcoming events; Bulky-Item Collection, October 6<sup>th</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> and Shred/E-waste & Compost Giveaway event on Saturday Oct 18<sup>th</sup> from 8-11am.
